



Workshop “Tamsalu Schoolyard” for young architects and architecture students

Introduction

The Estonian Association of Architects and the Youth Council of the association in collaboration with Tamsalu School are organizing a workshop „Tamsalu Schoolyard“ for architecture students and young architects, from June 12 to 15, 2025 in Tamsalu. The workshop aims to improve the outdoor space of the school, making it fulfil the requirements for efficient outdoor learning and promote movement. The solution should improve the quality of public space in Tamsalu, prospering regional development, bettering the quality of life of the immediate community as well as strengthening local identity. The basic principles of high-quality space and inclusive design will be followed throughout the process.

Objectives of the Workshop

1. Design at least two sheltered outdoor classrooms;
2. Propose different movement-promoting design solutions for the areas surrounding the school;
3. Enrich the school grounds with greenery – design thoughtfully planned green spaces;
4. Make necessary infrastructure changes, reducing the amount of paved surface in the schoolyard;
5. Redesign pathways to improve accessibility for both the school community and visitors.



Focus Area

Tamsalu is a town in the southeastern part of Tapa municipality, with just under 2,500 residents. The town structure is typical of small settlements – it lacks a defined centre, and key public functions are clustered in different parts of the town. Nevertheless, the infrastructure is well-developed: sports, cultural, and administrative services are well-represented compared to many other small towns in Estonia, and the local community is very active.

Tamsalu school, located in the centre of the town, houses the local division of Tapa Municipality High School and Tamsalu School, which provides primary and secondary education. The primary focus area of the workshop is the courtyard behind the main school building, currently occupied by an oversized parking lot and a shed that is set to be demolished soon. The secondary area that needs to be solved is the empty north-western part of the plot next to the stadium. When working on the task, the schoolyard should be considered holistically, including its surrounding impact zone. Currently, a fence with limited access points encloses the yard, and a large part of the site does not offer clear usage prompts for students. The influence area of the school site includes the Tamsalu Cultural Centre and its surrounding park, as well as nearby shops and apartment buildings.

Presentation Format

The proposed solution will be presented as a PowerPoint and an A1-sized poster in landscape format, providing a conclusive overview. The presentation must include:

- A site plan in a freely chosen scale;
- Drawings, schemes, and diagrams that characterise the solution;
- A short explanatory text;
- 3D visualisations and/or collages illustrating the idea.

Additional creative explanatory materials will also be highly valued.

Mentors

The workshop will be mentored by the Finnish architect and sound artist Joonas Parviainen (Arkkitehtitoimisto Joonas Parviainen) and Finnish artist and designer Susse Seppälä, the Estonian mentor will be announced later. In addition to professional mentors, specialists from the "Schools in Motion" program will provide preparatory lectures and guidance. The workshop will also introduce framework documents outlining the core principles of high-quality space to both young architects and local governments.

Organisation

The three-day workshop is open to architecture students and young architects from Estonia, Finland, Latvia, and Ukrainian war refugees residing in Estonia. A total of 28 participants are expected to take part. The participants will be divided into teams of four to five members, formed at the beginning of the workshop. Each team will have members from different schools/countries. On the first day, the work will take place in Tamsalu Cultural House; on subsequent days, the event will be held at Tamsalu School.

On the introductory day, the evening of June 12, participants will get acquainted with the project area and the general concept of the task. The following three days will focus on developing projects. Participants will receive feedback from mentors three times a day, and the workshop will conclude with a public

presentation of the final ideas. The local community, the school council, and representatives from Tapa municipality will also be involved in the process.
